Following the feedback obtained during the pilot test in Finland, and the discussion among the partners, it was decided that the e-learning platform will be updated soon. It will host all the training materials and tools that make up the training program.

Visitors will be able to register on the platform and create their own personal profiles. The platform will be easy to use and will be available in all partner languages. Innovative training material will be produced (continuous content development will be ensured during the project lifetime, based on all project activities) and will be converted into a harmonized format to facilitate the acquisition of appropriate knowledge.

It will be appropriately designed and presented so that it is also a valuable educational resource in its own right, ready to be used not only by youth workers and young people, but also independently in other relevant contexts.

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
